Motion Carried Josh Rabe with Downing Construction has been working with Dr. Paul Peters on a clinic to be located on the south edge of town. They have run into some challenges with the sanitary sewer. There is an existing sanitary sewer located across the highway, but no stub located on the side of the highway where the site is located. The site is located in the County (not in City limits) so there is an option to put in a septic system. The other option is to utilize the existing sanitary sewer by boring under the highway and bring the 8" main across to the site. The preliminary cost to do this is \$86,405. This option could open up future development opportunity in that area and he would like input and direction from the Council on this option area and he would like input and direction from the Council on this option. Councilperson Ostrander asked if there has been consideration on putting in a pipe large enough to accommodate going south. Josh said it would be an 8" main across, however if its too far south, the depth might be challenging. Councilperson Rigby asked about the location of the sanitary sewer. Josh said the site plan shows the most direct and cost-effective path for the san-itary sewer. Councilperson Rigby asked if the road that is approved by the DOT is an entrance to the site or a street. Josh confirmed that it is sized to serve multiple lots, but it is not a thru street. Councilperson Ostrander had concerns that the extension of the main wasn't long enough and the site having to be torn up later due to future development to the south. Dr. Peters would like to start construction this fall. Josh will provide the Council with the developer's proposed options, which will include a timeline and developer requests associated with the project. Senator Green addressed the Council and discussed the top three issues

Chevy and Dodge are behind on allo-cating vehicles and he has been told it will be a while until a vehicle can be allocated to the city. Chief Tasler mentioned that he is expecting a bill for the cage and everything going into the new police vehicle and would like to get that paid out of this fiscal year's budget. Mayor Brown noted that if the cost is within the scope of the police budget and wouldn't need any amendment or direction from the Council then he would have to manage the budget to cover that expenditure. As long as it is an expenditure that can be made under the that expenditure. As long as it is an expenditure that can be made under the current established budget and the processes the city currently has in place that is fine, if it takes council action, we would have to have a special council meeting. Legal counsel was ok with this approach. Don Lincoln provided the Council an update on the car show. They are

going to have to raise the registration fees as the trophy cost has gone up \$1,800.00. Pre-registration cost will be \$20.00 and day of show registration cost will be \$25.00. Don is working with the Deputy City Clerk on closing streets and received applications for dram shop insurance from the Labor Day Commission. He will be working with Public Works and the Fire Department on a safe route to get rescue and fire trucks out in case of emergen-cies. He is also looking for more manpower to help with parking and getting through the pre-registration area.
