Erich Kretzinger, Boone County Supervisor, provided an update on the Boone County Communications Center. Boone County is looking into revising the 28E agreement with the cities that help fund the communications center. The estimated annual cost of running the communications center is \$760,000. Erich provided the Council with an FY 22-23 joint funding proposal showing a per capita budget cost share for each community plus the rural taxpayers. According to the proposal, Madrid would be responsible for \$37,391.00 which is an increase of \$4,601.00 from previous years. The next step is for Boone County to draft a 28E agreement for all communities involved. Erich will set up a meeting with Chief Tasler on any concerns or improvements that could be made on the services the City receives from the Boone County Communications Center.

Don Lincoln provided an update on the Madrid Area Chamber of Commerce activities. The Chamber has prioritized the goals in the marketing plan and the first step is to make improvements to the website. They will also look at options to improve communications between the City and Madrid residents. The Chamber will also be drafting a short survey for area businesses to evaluate how the Chamber is helping the business community. New brochures have been printed to hand out at the lowa State Fair to promote Madrid. There are still time slots available to sign up to volunteer to help and people can sign up online.

Library Director Angie Strong provided an update on library activities. The library is fully accredited until 2024. The library has received several grants: 1) \$1,500.00 from Community Chest which will be used towards Creativebug and READsquared databases and to replace one of the public access computers; 2) \$350.00 from Hopkins Grove to be used towards educational backpacks; and 3) \$5,000.00 from the State Library to be used towards an outdoor solar charger, new computer monitors, and a security camera. The library has also applied for the Lowrey Grant. Last year, the library had provided 1,462 grab and go kits for early out programs. The library will not have a Friends book sale the weekend before Labor Day and is looking into having smaller scale book sales in the fall.

Police Chief Rick Tasler provided an update on public safety activities. The new vehicle is available and he is waiting for the equipment to be installed. He hopes to have the new vehicle in service at the end of August. In the past 2 years, the Police Department has received a \$125,000 grant, hired a fourth officer and has purchased a new vehicle. Chief Tasler will be gone for the September 7th Council meeting as he will be on vacation that week. Staffing should be sufficient for the Labor Day Celebration.

Martha Furness provided an update on Senior Activities Commission activities. There have been several rentals and a few inquiries at the center. She is waiting for Huxley Communications to provide internet to the building. Boone County Hospital has no date to resume congregate meals because of the delta variant. The Meals-on-Wheels program is still available.

Don Lincoln thanked Rick Tasler and his private business for the \$500.00 donation to use towards the Labor Day car show trophies.

City Administrator/Clerk Kristen Renslow stated the State of Iowa is giving more CARES money to cities and are issuing up to \$9,500 worth of technology bundles. No matching funds are required and they will begin taking orders August 2 – 15. Kristen will work with the Mayor, Councilperson Samples and J&D Computers on determining which bundles would be beneficial for
